

JSTOR FAQs

- **Is all journal content on JSTOR peer reviewed?**

Nearly all of the journals collected in JSTOR are peer-reviewed publications, but the archives also contain primary sources and content that is much older than today's standard peer-review process.

- **Why can't I access the full-text of all content on JSTOR?**

Libraries can select different collections on JSTOR, and your library may not subscribe to all collections. Contact your librarian for more information.

- **What is the "moving wall?"**

Much of the journal content on JSTOR has a "moving wall," a set period of time (usually three to five years) between a journal issue's publication date and its availability as archival content on JSTOR.
